Recommended that practitioners spend 1 hour per month on audit activity

Clinical Audit <i>Audit activities should be focused on the practice of the practitioner and not on the processes.</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Measurement of compliance with guidelines/protocols e.g., initiation of antiretroviral therapy, mother-to-child transmission of HIV, syphilis management, partner notification, PEP/PEPSE, cervical cytology • Appropriateness of lab testing eg, use of antiretroviral resistance testing, therapeutic drug monitoring, HLA B5701 testing • Results management • Patient clinic journey • Consult service • Audit of documentation of clinical advice 	Minimum 1 audit per year. Recommended that practitioners spend 1 hour per month on audit activity

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Infectious Diseases

HIV infection (eg antiretroviral prescribing per guidelines, OI management, cardiovascular assessment, liver disease surveillance, vaccination rates, cytology surveillance, disclosure etc) 2. sexual health – management of infections eg syphilis, contact tracing, vaccination rates 3. general infectious diseases – antimicrobial prescribing, OPAT standards, management of malaria, bone and joint infection management, staphylococcal aureus infection management, hepatitis B treatment - Department/practice audit - Individual Practice review - Evaluation of individual risk incidents/complaints - Patient satisfaction surveys - Self assessment - Peer review (360) 	<p>Minimum 1 audit per year.</p> <p>Recommended that practitioners spend 1 hour per month on audit activity</p>

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Neurology

Clinical Audit <i>Audit activities should be focused on the practice of the practitioner and not on the processes.</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Neurology inpatient care (ward, ITC, special care unit, day unit, etc) - Outpatient Care (waiting time, waiting list, ratio of new to old patients, patient satisfaction, outcomes) - Inpatient acute neurology consult service - Administration issues (GP referrals, forms to be completed, letters of reply to patients, relatives, complaints from patients, relatives etc, references for junior doctors, forms to be completed for the various bodies including RCPI etc for juniors) - Academic (including teaching and research) - Patient Advocacy 	Minimum 1 audit per year. Recommended that practitioners spend 1 hour per month on audit activity

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Palliative Medicine

Clinical Audit <i>Audit activities should be focused on the practice of the physician and not on the processes.</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Measurement of individual/departmental compliance with guidelines/protocols/company SOPs - Setting standards – implementation guidelines development - Audit of work site to ensure that practitioners have suitable and adequate facilities to ensure that they can perform their duties and have adequate support - Self assessment - Peer review 	Minimum 1 audit per year. Recommended that practitioners spend 1 hour per month on audit activity

Recommended that practitioners spend 1 hour per month on audit activity

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Respiratory Medicine

Clinical Audit <i>Audit activities should be focused on the practice of the practitioner and not on the processes.</i>	<p>Individual Practice review</p> <p>Self assessment</p> <p>Measurement of individual/departmental compliance with guidelines/protocols or assessment of outcomes</p> <p>Participation in ERS COPD audit</p> <p>Compliance with lung cancer guidelines, guidelines on treatment/investigation of pneumonia, pulmonary embolism, COPD</p> <p>Turnaround times for departmental activities – out-patient referral, bronchoscopy, sleep assessment etc.</p> <p>Appropriateness of PFT/sleep study requests</p> <p>Appropriateness of home oxygen/nebuliser/CPAP/NIV prescribing</p>	<p>Minimum 1 audit per year.</p> <p>Recommended that practitioners spend 1 hour per month on audit activity</p>

Minimum 1 audit per year. Recommended that practitioners spend 1 hour per month on audit activity

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
